EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP HONOURS CLUB STALWART

Over the last five years, 25 dedicated Queenscliff clubbies looking to further their tertiary studies have benefited from an annual scholarship and now, in a moving gesture, the club has renamed the award in honour of one of its own.

From 2015, the scholarship will be known as the Peter Daley Tertiary Scholarship in memory of the late club president, Queenscliff SLSC and Branch Life Member who sadly passed away last year. The decision to rename the award was taken by the founder of the scholarship John Cunningham and the club itself who wanted to honour their long-time mate.

"The name change came from an offer I put to the club and to Peter's family after his passing to honour him and his commitment to the betterment of the kids growing up with Queenscliff in their veins," said scholarship founder, John Cunningham.

"Peter was passionate about

everything, but especially the personal development of his charges. He was instrumental in getting the scholarship underway as well as being on the selection committee every year. He also supported it financially himself in an effort to boost the coffers."

The 2015 scholarship winners are William Bellow, Philippa Butt, Nick Warby, Chris Dagger and Lauren Susans. All five are currently studying undergraduate or postgraduate degrees at institutes across Sydney and are grateful for the support that the scholarship provides.

Pip Butt who is studying a Masters degree in Business Administration through the University of Sydney said she appreciates the support that both Queenscliff SLSC and Mr Cunningham have given to all recipients.

"For a club to invest in its members outside of the usual Surf Life Saving training and development pathways recognises the additional skills our

volunteers bring and demonstrates its commitment to the club's future," she said.

Chris Dagger intends using his scholarship to help ease the cost of travelling to uni and buying textbooks, while Lauren Susans who is in the final year of her degree feels that it allows the students to continue their involvement with the club while they study.

"I think the scholarship itself is a great idea as it encourages ongoing involvement in the surf club," she said
