

Reserve Active Member Status and Long Service Membership (November, 2016)

What is the purpose of this policy?

This policy provides the criteria for Reserve Active QSLSC member status and for QSLSC Long Service Membership. This policy also provides the process for applying, assessing and approving both Reserve Active member status and for Long Service membership

The Club Constitution provides for the member category of Long Service but not for a membership category of "Active Reserve". The Constitution stipulates that Long Service membership may be awarded for members who have completed not less than 10 years of patrol service.

Competitors with approved Reserve Active status must do not less than 12 hours patrol within a calendar year to be eligible to compete in the following year.

Criteria - "reserve active" member status and Long Service membership category

1. Reserve Active Status

A member is eligible for Reserve Active status if they have not less than 8 years of patrol service and not less than 200 patrol hours in total.

2. Long Service Membership

A member is eligibility for Long Service membership if they have not less than 10 years of patrol service and not less than 250 patrol hours in total.

Process – applying, assessing and approving "reserve active" member status and Long Service membership category

1. Reserve Active Status

Members may apply for Reserve Active status via a written application that may take the form of an email. Applications must be addressed to the Club Administration.

The Secretary with the assistance of the Club Admin Officer will review applications to confirm they meet the criteria of 8 years of patrol service and not less than 200 patrol hours in total and where appropriate, recommend to the Club Captain that applications be submitted to the Board for approval.

2. Long Service membership

Members may apply for Long Service Membership via a written application that may take the form of an email. Applications must be addressed to the Club Administration.

The Secretary with the assistance of the Club Admin Officer will review applications to confirm they meet the criteria of 10 years of patrol service and not less than 250 patrol hours in total and where appropriate, recommend to the Club Captain that applications be submitted to the Board for approval.
